Santa Barbara Beautiful Celebrates Beautification!

ERKY CHRYSANTHEMUMS dotted the tables as guests at the annual Santa Barbara Beautiful Annual Awards began to take their places, mingling in the sun dappled country garden at the Music Academy of the West. Awardees, associates, and friends shared stories and enthusiasm as the afternoon gracefully unfurled, imbued with the theme, Timeless Santa Barbara. The awards event celebrates individuals and teams of people that have excelled in the eyes of their peers at Timeless Santa Barbara beautifying Santa Barbara.

Barbara is a place we call home - full of beauty created by citizens, architects, planners, landscape architects, and business owners. Over the last nearly 50 years, Santa Barbara Beautiful has been dedicated to creating, preserving, enriching, and celebrating this wonderful environment. With our community, we have gathered tonight, and that is what the annual awards are about," related Kate Kurlas, 2014 SBB

Jeanette Casillas and Ricardo Castellanos, Annual Awards Co-Chairs, greeted guests as they arrived, along with most of the 30 plus Board of Directors, who showed up early to help out and have photographer Priscilla capture a shot of them for posterity.

Highlights of the reception included delicious Lieff Wines, hors d'oeuvres by Lorraine Lim Catering, and live music by a classical music string sibling trio, Three for Joy.

The party moved from the lush gardens into sumptuous Hahn Hall where Three for Joy continued to ply the crowd as they gathered for a short video about the non-profit and its work

in the community. Evident was the growth in collaboration between Santa Barbara Beautiful and other non-profit entities in the community, several of whom sent representatives to the gala celebration.

Kurlas took the stage to welcome the consummate Mistress of Ceremonies, Paula Lopez, who returned for the third year to do the

With genuine warmth, Lopez introduced SBB Board Members, SBB Past Presidents, Award Judges, and honored guests, and then the

awards presentations began.

Presentations moved from property

teams to individuals, to awards from the City of Santa Barbara Arts Advisory Committee, to a new award this year, the Santa Barbara Botanic Garden's Native Choice Award.

The President's Award was first up. It was presented by Kurlas to Margaret L. Cafarelli and team for Alma del Pueblo.

Next was an award to the Lobero Theatre for Historic Revitalization. The Lobero Theatre has revitalized both its exterior and interior using the original plans and designs of renowned architects George Washington Smith and Lutah Maria Riggs.

The Hugh Petersen Award for Art in Public Places followed with a presentation for the Joseph Knowles' California Mosaic Mural now located at Alma del Pueblo. Knowles' son was present to accept the award.

An award to the Boat House Restaurant at Hendry's Beach for their commercial sign followed. Then members of the team responsible for the upgrades of the Public Open Space at the Sea Landing Walkway took the stage. The newly designed oceanfront entry to Santa Barbara was

envisioned as a palm-lined esplanade.

The Heritage Oak Award, an individual award for Lifetime Achievement, was presented to Isabelle Greene by SBB Treasurer Robert F. Adams. Greene is an internationally lauded landscape architect, with over 600 gardens in Santa Barbara and across the country to her

credit. She has regularly demonstrated that lushness is available without excessive water use.

Greene and the President's Award recipient will receive a commemorative tree marker honoring their contributions to the community.

Ms. Greene's award was followed by the Multi-Family Residence Award to the beautiful property at 121 West De La Guerra. Its design revolved around preserving an old Norfolk Pine, creating an Old Santa Barbara feel.

Then a colorful entry in the Single Family home category offering a bold, vibrant, color scheme adorned with paintings by local artists. This home at 521 Santa Barbara Street, designed by Jeff Shelton, Architect, embodies an artistic approach to living.

A Commercial Property Award to The Anacapa Project at 131-137 Anacapa Street in the lively Funk Zone neighborhood followed. It offers a synergy in this pedestrian friendly quarter, that invites patrons to wander through the spaces between businesses and along the street, between Lark Restaurant, Figueroa Mountain Brewery, Cutlers, Guitar Bar, RiverBench Winery, and Lucky Penny

A break in property awards made room for the inaugural Santa Barbara Botanic Garden Native Choice Award, presented

to the Santa Barbara Bowl Foundation by Steve Windhager, PhD, Executive Director of the Garden. "We honor this vital nonprofit for its vision and environmental leadership for choosing natives in its spectacularly designed landscapes," Windhager related. "The Bowl's multi-phased landscape design renovation includes three sites that wholeheartedly reflect the spirit of the Native Choice Award: the Overlook, the Glen, and the landscaping around the new Box Office."

Two more property awards followed. For Architectural Feature, the team from the Lucky Penny received kudos for their "Penny Wall." This feature was a community project with

penny donations and volunteer labor attaching thousands of copper disks to the building. It's a striking piece.

Next, a bit of architectural history was honored with the Single Family Estate Award, which went to the Prynce Hopkins House located at 1900 Garden Street known as 'El Nido' or 'The Nest.' This venerable home was designed by local architect Francis Wilson for Charles and Mary Hopkins of San Francisco, and completed in 1897.

The Business in Art Award from the City of Santa Barbara Arts Advisory Committee held the anchor position this year. It was presented to Laura Knight, Owner of Pascucci Restaurant by Santa Barbara County Arts Commission Executive Director Ginny Brush. The Award itself was created by local assemblage artist Sue Van Horsen. Through her restaurant Knight has provided generous sponsorships and financial support to numerous nonprofit organizations in Santa Barbara, including the Celebrity Solstice Night fundraiser which in its 13-year history has raised

In all, there were thirteen awards presented in a fast moving video-rich program. It was topped off with a champagne and sparkling cider toast in Hahn Hall Plaza, where guests continued their conversations and enthusiasm.


