Santa Barbara Beautiful Annual Awards

Celebrating 50 Years of Beautification!

HE SAYING IS, WITH AGE COMES WISDOM, IT CAN ALSO BRING AN AMAZING FACILITY FOR **CELEBRATION.** Santa Barbara Beautiful (SBB) proved this recently when it kicked up its heels celebrating its 50th year of honoring locals who beautify

our city. With more than 250 in attendance at a delightful and intimate garden party set at the Music Academy of the West, directly followed by a videopaced awards ceremony in the beautiful Hahn Hall, SBB board, volunteers, judges, community, dignitaries, and awardees kibitzed and celebrated.

Imbued with the grace of sunshine and light breezes, the event, themed Celebrating 50 Years of Beautification, honored individuals and teams of people that have excelled in the eyes of

their peers and community at beautifying Santa Barbara.

"We had a great turnout and the ceremony was befitting of Santa Barbara Beautiful's legacy of beautification for 50 years. The Awards Committee did a fantastic job of putting on such a special event that just seems to keep getting better each year," related Jeanette Casillas, 2015 SBB President.

Ricardo Castellanos and Jo Ann Mermis, Annual Awards Co-Chairs, greeted guests as they arrived, along with many of the Board of Directors, who showed up early to help out and have photographer Priscilla capture a shot of them for posterity.

Highlights of the reception included hors d'oeuvres by Tam Trinh's Spices N Rice; Lieff and Brander Wines; Figueroa Mountain Brewing Co. craft beer; Flowers by Por La Mar Nursery; a photo booth by Just4Fun Party Rentals; and live music by The Bob Ledner Trio.

The party moved from the lush gardens into sumptuous Hahn Hall where The Bob Ledner Trio continued to play as the crowd gathered for a short video created by Roadshow Media about the non-profit and its work in the community which set the stage for an up and

Casillas took the stage to congratulate awardees and to welcome Santa Barbara's Citizen of the Year and Master of Ceremonies John Palminteri, a long-time supporter of the organization.

The Santa Barbara Beautiful annual awards strive

to recognize those stand out people and teams in our community who have been dedicated to creating, preserving, and enriching Santa Barbara's wonderful environment. It's a tradition that we hope to continue for many years to come," Casillas shared.

Palminteri invited Santa Barbara's Mayor Helene Schneider on stage. She welcomed guests and introduced

Santa Barbara's Poet Laureate Sojourner Kincaid Rolle who read a poem she wrote for the dedication of a tree commemorating the organization's 50 years.

With humor and famous smile, Palminteri introduced SBB Board Members, SBB Past Presidents, Award Judges, and honored guests. Then the awards presentations began.

Presentations moved between property teams and individuals, to the City of Santa Barbara Arts Advisory Committee's Business and Art Award to the Santa Barbara Botanic Garden's Native Choice Award. (See pages 16-17)

The Griswold Award for Philanthropy was presented by SB County Supervisor Salud Carbajal to Jean Kellogg Schuyler, who was present to accept the award. "Jean has been a leader on many difficult conservation issues that started as impossible dreams and ended in success," Carbajal quoted a Land Trust for SB County Past President. Throughout her life Schuyler's love for the outdoors inspired her commitment to the environment and participation on numerous boards. Her sons Peter and John Schuyler were present with her.

Next was the award for Historic Revitalization which went to The New Vic Theater at 33 West Victoria Street. The solid, hand built former Gothic Revival style church received a total revitalization when it was transformed into The New Vic Theater. Complementing its unique character, the building opened wide to welcome the functional requirements of a revamped, cutting edge theatre space. Every detail of the renovated building shows meticulous attention to revitalizing the interior while keeping the character of the exterior intact.

The Award for Commercial Sign followed, going

to The Santa Barbara Company at 214 E. Victoria St. Whimsical and friendly, the locally produced sign offers a cut out metal bird on top, a birdhouse built into the back, and cylindrical tile and metalwork in muted colors. Lit from inside its roof, the unique sign is easy to read.

The President's Award was next, presented by Casillas to Sonos, Inc. Accepting the award for Sonos

were Ingvar Meijers, Robin Donaldson, Allison Griffin, and Lane Goodkind. Casillas started her presentation with, "An imagination capturing urban vibe, created with planes of natural wood, metal, glass, and drought tolerant plantings, along with plenty of sweat and creativity has emerged as an important characteristic of the President's Award recipient this year, 614 Chapala Street. It's a millennial nuance originating at Sonos."

The Single Family Estate Award was presented to Hodges House at 2112 Santa Barbara Street followed by the Award for Public Open Space to the recently completed Bath Street Pocket Park.

The second Santa Barbara Botanic Garden Native Choice Award was presented to Virginia L.T. Gardner by Steve Windhager, PhD, Executive Director of the Garden. The garden is a beautiful example of an eclectic design sense developing over 15 years and is located in the front yard at 2014 Garden Street. It boasts color and interest in all seasons including Palmer's mallow, Island Buckwheat, purple sage, Ceanothus 'Puget Blue" and California Buckwheat.

The Hugh Petersen Award for Art In Public Places was next, going to the Anacapa Project Gates at 00

Block East Yanonali Street. In the trendy, millennial Mecca of the Funk Zone, The Anacapa Gates, make their home on a highly traversed walkway. Consisting of six murals fastened to corrugated steel gates and well integrated with the building's decor and overhangs, and down lighting that brightens the walkway at night, the murals draw drivers and pedestrian's

The Multi-Family Residence award was next, followed by the Architectural Feature Award.

The Business in Art Award from the City of Santa Barbara Arts Advisory Committee followed. The award honored the work of Marc and Laurie Recordon from Hotel Indigo for their work incorporating art in their business, including huge murals by nationally known artists on the south face of their

The Single Family Residence Award was presented next, followed by the award for Commercial Property.

Bringing the awards ceremony to a close - except for a final Champagne toast in the front courtyard, was Deborah L. Schwartz, SBB Treasurer who presented Phil McKenna, Board President of Gaviota Coast Conservancy with the Playa De Santa Barbara Award for Environmental Stewardship. The Conservancy is an advocacy group representing one of

California's rare, undeveloped rural coastlines that seeks to protect and preserve its unique character.

In all, there were fourteen awards presented in a fast moving video-rich program lasting 60 minutes.

"We are very fortunate to have a community of talented professionals who, through their work, contribute to the beauty of Santa Barbara," shared Castellanos and Mermis, Awards Co-Chairs.
